# **SCS Installation**

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# **Preliminary Check**

These are the necessary steps which must be completed after installation of the SCS module.

- 1. If the analog inputs are to be used, verify that they are in the correct range as the SCS is calibrated (0-10V,0-20mA). If the input ranges are not correct, it is recommended to adjust them to a standard range.
- 2. Check the software version from the adjustment-menu 4.01, make sure that the software loaded into SCS is the correct one, ask you dealer what software version is installed in your SCS.
- 3. Check the speed reference inputs
  - Disconnect directional outputs (R/L) to the inverter drive, or power off the inverter drive.
  - Check the monitor output for bridge and trolley when inputs are applied to SCS.
  - Check E-Stop button if it is detected by SCS.
  - Connect the direction outputs or power up the inverter drive.
  - Connect SCS by applying sling input of 0000.
  - Operate the bridge and trolley motions to ensure that the wiring is correct.
- 4. Height Measurement
  - Analog Input; Check the height measurement monitor while operating the bridge and trolley; observe if there is any disturbance/noise in the height measurement. If noise/ disturbance appears, the height measurement monitor will show unstable readings.
  - Incremental Encoder; Set the hoist at a certain position and move the bridge trolley. Check the measurement.
  - Signal Cable; It is recommended to use a shielded twist pair cable with the shield grounded at **BOTH ENDS**.

#### Setting Up the SCS Software

After wiring the preliminary check has been completed, the next step in the SCS installation is to set up the parameters that the SCS software will need in controlling the sway of the crane.

A step-by-step example of how to do adjustments in the SCS software menu is as follows:

- Turn power 'on'
- Wait until display shows "Electromotive"
- Press 'Enter' once, display shows 'Language'
- Press ↑ twice, display shows 'Adjustment'
- Press 'Enter' once
- Press ↑ twice, then security code shows '2000'
- Press 'Enter' five times, display shows '1.00 Bridge'
- Press ↑ once, display shows 2.00 Trolley, press 'Enter'
- Press  $\uparrow$  six times, display shows 2.07 Mode
- Press 'Enter', press ↑ four times, display shows 'Prop Smooth'
- Press 'Enter' once, press 'ESC' twice
- Press 'Enter' to save the change
- Press 'ESC' to go back to initial display

## **Menu Functions**

SCS uses a fluorescent display and keypads as an interface to adjust the parameters, this interface allows parameter adjustments and also input/output monitoring.

#### Language

This menu allows user to change the language used in the display. At this time, the available languages are German and English. This menu will be expanded up to 8 different languages in the future.

#### Monitor

Monitor menu allows users to check the actual input and output values from SCS's display without using a separate multimeter or other measurement device. This menu makes it easier to detect wiring faults and test the system during adjustment.

#### Bridge

This display shows the actual input and output for the "Bridge". An example of the "Bridge" display is:



This means, that a digital input is in use with speed reference input signal at 3rd step, and 100% speed reference at the output.

If for example the display shows the following:

Bridge IN: 074% OUT: 043% This means an analog signal is in use with 74% speed reference at the input and 43% at the output.

*NOTE:* The output of the SCS software varies to the calculated value even when the input remains at the same value, since the SCS's software algorithm is calculating and updating speed reference

For example, the display shows the following:

Bridge
Emergency STOP

The main input is open, or the Emergency stop switch is activated.

If for example the display shows the following:

Bridge		
<b>IN: Error</b>	OUT: 100%	

There is an incorrect input signal (e.g. 2nd step signal without direction) and the output is 0%.

#### **Trolley:**

The display functions for the "Trolley" are the same as the bridge section.

#### Limit Switches and Sling Length:

This display shows the state and the use of the limit switches and the sling length. An example of this display is:



Limit Switch:	<u>1</u> : The input is enabled, and the switch is closed.
	<u>0</u> : The input is enabled, and the switch is open.
	$\underline{X}$ : The input is disabled, no switch is used.

Sling length: <u>1</u> bit is enabled and <u>0</u> bit is not enabled.

#### **Height Measurement:**

This display shows the current height measured by SCS software. An example of height measurement display is:

Height Meas. 05.7 Meter

#### **Swing Time**

This menu allows the user to check the calculated swing time in both the bridge and trolley direction. An example of the swing time display is:

Swing Tim	le	
B: 01.41s	K: 01.52s	

<u>B</u> equals load swing time in the bridge motion, <u>K</u> equals load swing time in the trolley motion (Katze). If load swing control does not operate correctly, measure the swing period with a stopwatch and compare the value with this monitoring value. If the values are not identical or close (+/-.3 sec), error is most likely in the height measurement.

*NOTE:* To get accurate swing time it is recommended to measure the time of 10 full swing periods and divide the result by 10 to get the accurate swing time. If the swing time does not change while the load is driven up or down it is likely that there is a fault in the height measurement device. Swing time should increase when the load is lowered and decrease while the load is hoisted.

Height measurement can be adjusted manually, or by a simple test. If the test is chosen, the test range (1, 2 or 3 meters) needs to be selected first.

Figure 2-8: Scaling sets the slope angle of the measurement sensor input versus rope length curve.

Range test is a practical method to adjust the load height measurement. Make sure the measurement sensor is operating correctly and measurement range does not go over minimum /maximum limits of the analog signal.

- 1. Select test range (1, 2 or 3 meters), using the previous parameter, test difference for scaling.
- 2. Start the test using the ENTER key.
- 3. Press  $\uparrow$  to clear the test count register.
- 4. Lift the hook exactly the distance set by the parameter 3.03.
- 5. Stop the test by pressing the ENTER key.

Now the height measured per measurement unit is stored into the SCS software controller's memory. The measurement then expects that at the upper end of the measurement load is in the higher position and the rope length is zero. Since the rope length does not actually GO to zero, the adjustment is made by adding a constant value to the calculated height value, see 3.05 & 3.06 Swing Time/height measurement adjustment.

#### The adjustment for Bridge and Trolley is the same procedure:

When setting this parameter, the sling length is recommended to be set for 0 meters. When the hook is empty. Since the rope length never actually goes to zero, the adjustment is made by adding a constant value to the calculated height value. The correct value is set using the following steps. A test should be conducted.

Measure the swing time by using a stop watch. To get a good measurement value it is recommended to measure the time of several swing periods and then divide the time by the number of periods to get the time for one period. Increase or decrease the adjustment value using up/down keys ( $\uparrow$  plus,  $\downarrow$  Minus) until the swing time displayed is the same as you measured.

Test the operation by stopping the crane and dampening all sing of the load. Give a short speed command, about one second long and let the crane move a short distance. Observe the load sway. If the load and the crane stop exactly at the same time and there is no end sway the load height measurement is correct. Repeat the test on several different heights to ensure that the measurement is correct over the whole height range.

If there is end sway after the above test, we need to detect when the crane stops and what the load position is at that moment. If the crane stops too soon or before the load has reached the lowest position (exactly under the pivot point) the measured load pendulum length is too short. If the crane continues moving too long and the load sways over the lowest point under the pivot point before the crane stops, the load height measurement value is too long.

#### **Hoist Control**

Increase and decrease the adjustment value according to the above test result and repeat the test until you have acceptable crane operation. Please note while making this test the SCS software algorithm must be activated and the sling length must be set to zero.

In most systems, setting up the height measurement using range test and swing time renders a good result. If your application requires better end sway, double-check swing time on different heights.

- 1. Parallel inputs wiring. If parallel inputs are in use with decoder modules (Electromotive Systems Decoder), there is a series of resistors of 1k that need to be added on each digital (5V) inputs to prevent over current in the input line when SCS is off.
- 2. After adjusting the height measurements, SCS needs to be reset by cycling power.

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# Servicing SCS

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## Service

This chapter includes information pertaining to on-call service, drive identification, troubleshooting, and warranty. Before you install, troubleshoot, or service the drive, we highly recommend you read this entire chapter. Doing this will help assure quick service response, minimize your on-site repair costs, and reduce crane downtime.

Your *SCS Module* includes a two-year warranty from date of shipment. The warranty is described in detail later in this chapter. The absolute encoder encludes a one year warranty from time of shipment.

#### **On-Call Service**

If you ever require our assistance, contact us at (800) 288-8178; our fax number is (800) 298-3508. Technical support is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and 365 days a year. If necessary, we can arrange to have a Service Technician visit your site to evaluate the situation.

#### **Service Policy For SCS Components**

This section explains Electromotive Systems' service policy for the SCS components.

Should your *SCS* product fail during the warranty period, Electromotive Systems will repair or replace your unit within 72 hours (3 working days). In most cases, we can supply a replacement unit within 24 hours (1 working day). If the problem is not covered under warranty, you are responsible for the cost of the repairs and the shipping charges.

To return a failed unit (or part):

- 1. Request a Return Authorization (RA) from Electromotive Systems' Service Department, as a condition for us to repair or replace the unit. Return the failed unit to Electromotive Systems **via pre-paid freight**. When you call, please have the serial number of the drive available and be prepared to provide the information requested on the Return Authorization Information Sheet found on page A-4.
- 2. A purchase order or credit card is required to cover the cost of the replacement unit or repairs to a returned unit.

Electromotive Systems will inspect the failed unit and determine if the unit is covered under warranty.

• If the unit is covered under warranty, Electromotive Systems will credit the cost of the replacement unit and/or repairs and reimburse you for all reasonable freight charges.

#### *NOTE:* Freight charges incurred from sources other than common ground carriers <u>WILL</u> <u>NOT</u> be reimbursed unless pre-approved by Electromotive Systems.

• If the unit is not covered under warranty, Electromotive Systems will bill you for the cost of the replacement unit or the cost of repairs. Electromotive Systems will also bill you for a \$125.00 inspection fee (this fee will be waived if repairs are made to the unit) and any freight charges incurred by Electromotive Systems.
